Course Duration: 150 hours

Course Objectives:

- To understand and perform basic communication in limited daily situations using around 1000+ vocabulary and 150 sentence patterns.
- · To understand the three scripts: Hiragana, Katakana, and 240 Kanji characters.

Course Outcomes:

Upon completion of the course, successful students:

- Can understand and perform communicative tasks in standard Japanese requiring simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters.
- · Can compose sentences and personal responses to questions, employing sentence patterns and *kanji* learnt at this level.
- · Can read and write *Hiragana*, *Katakana*, around 240 *kanji*, and demonstrate comprehension of short conversations.
